**SUBJECT:** Serving Students with Cortical/Cerebral Vision Impairment

The purpose of this memo and attached guidance document is to provide Exceptional Children Directors and IEP teams with non-biased information regarding students who have a neurological visual impairment, which includes Cortical/Cerebral Visual Impairment (CVI).

Questions and concerns have been received by the Exceptional Children Division recently in light of increased attention to CVI in the state and across the nation. The guidance document is a step to provide initial guidance and support. Exceptional Children Division Consultants for Vision Impairment and the Consultant for Deaf-blind will stay abreast of information and issues, updating the field as necessary using one or more of the following platforms:
