SBE considers CSAB recommendations for each acceleration applicant opening in 2024 and may grant approval of the charter contingent upon successful completion of the Planning Year (also known as "Ready to Open" Process). SBE may consider accelerated applications prior to November; timeline will depend on the number of accelerated applications received.

- CSAB continues review of all remaining applications.
- Interview for each applicant, members of the Board of Directors (BOD) for the proposed school make themselves available to address questions/concerns posed by CSAB.
- CSAB conducts interviews of each invited applicant BOD before the full CSAB (Round One Interviews).
- The full CSAB deliberates following each applicant interview with three recommendation options:
 - o CSAB forwards recommendation for approval to SBE
 - CSAB advances application to Round Two interview
 - CSAB denies application

^{*} Fast-track applications will be prioritized based on statutory deadlines. Decisions by the State Board of Education on whether to grant a charter through the replication process are completed in less than 120 days from the application submission date. The State Board shall provide a decision no later than October 15 of the year immediately preceding the year of the proposed school opening. GS § 115C-218.3.

	CSAB makes final recommendations on all applications and forwards regular timeline applications to SBE for discussion. SBE may consider regular timeline applications prior to December; timeline will depend on the number of applications received.
January 2024	SBE discusses application recommendations.
February 2024	SBE votes on application recommendations.
