General Education Application Form

Application must be completed by student and submitted to district Administrator/School Personnel for further consideration. Nomination packets **MUST** be submitted to NCDPI by district or charter personnel, **NOT** by the student or parent.

Eligibility:

- High school seniors graduating between January and June 2023
- Must be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident

Timeline:

Student applications are due to the public school unit (PSU - district or charter)	Locally established due date

U.S. Commission announces the 2023 Semifinalists	mid-April 2023
U.S. Commission announces the 2023 U.S. Presidential Scholars	early-May 2023
State Board of Education recognizes the U.S. Presidential Scholars selected from North Carolina	early-June

Process:

- Students will confirm due date of initial application with local school district.
- Students will submit completed application to local PSU (public school unit).
- PSU's will evaluate applications and select final nominations for the PSU (number of eligible nominees is based on senior student enrollment*).
- PSU's will submit final nomination packet to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) – Office of Advanced Learning and Gifted Education for further consideration. NCDPI will send a confirmation receipt to the email sender within 24 hours.
- NCDPI will evaluate all candidate nomination packet and documents.
- NCDPI will submit the names of twenty State nominees (10 males and 10 females) to the U.S. Commission on Presidential Scholars by November 30, 2022.
- All State nominees will be added to the larger pool of nominees from across the United States. Finalists are announced, and then invited to apply directly to the U.S. Commission on Presidential Scholars in mid-January 2023.
- Completed applications will be due in February, and final U.S. Presidential Scholars will be announced by early-May 2023.

To be considered, all nomination packets (application with all three parts including any supporting documents) must be completed with signatures and received digitally **by 5:00 pm on Friday, November 4, 2022** using the following process:

1. Compile each student nomination packet as a separate digital file.
2. Name each file according to the following nomenclature:
(PSU) Presidential Scholars Nomination- (Last Name of Student).

For example: Pender Presidential Scholars Nomination - Smith

3. Attach nomination packet(s) to an email and send to crissy.brown@dpi.nc.gov using the following subject line: **(PSU) Presidential Scholars Nomination(s).**

Triangle Math and Science Academy Presidential Scholars Nomination
