What is the Federal Personnel Survey?

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Personnel OSEP Requirements

Collect data on the number of full-time equivalent (FTE):

- special education teachers (EdFacts File Spec 070)
- paraprofessionals (EdFacts File Spec 112)
- related services personnel (EdFacts File Spec 099) who are employed or contracted to work with children with disabilities (IDEA) who were ages 3 through 21 on the December 1 Child Count.

Due Date March 14, 2022

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Rationale for Combining Surveys

- In previous years, North Carolina's federal personnel data has been unstable and inaccurate.
- Related services consultants have conducted separate workforce surveys; this inclusive update affords helpful workforce data for EC directors/coordinators.
- Combining surveys reduces redundant data entry.
- The changes will clarify data input and assist in making the data accurate, valid and reliable.

Survey Data Preparation and Clarification

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Survey Data Preparation

- Print PDF of each section of the survey
- Gather required data (FTE, Salary) from Human Resources

EC Consultants listed by Discipline or Content Area

Clarification

- Report personnel employed to serve students with disabilities ages 3 through 21 regardless of funding source (e.g., Part B of IDEA, State, local funding)
- Do not include personnel who serve children from birth through age 2 <u>unless</u> they also serve children with disabilities ages 3 through 21
- For teachers and other instructional personnel who work with children ages 3 through PK5 report them if they either:
 - Hold appropriate state certification or licensure for the position held.
 - Hold positions for which no state requirements exist (e.g., no certification or licensure requirements).
- Teachers and other instructional personnel who work with children ages 5K-21 must hold appropriate state certification or license for the position held.

Clarification

- The related services data are not a comprehensive count of all types of personnel who provide services to children with disabilities (IDEA).
- Report only those related services personnel types listed in the survey. Those listed are only what the federal report requires.

Question Key

Number of Licensed Staff in this role= This is the total number of licensed personnel in the discipline or curriculum hired for this role regardless of funding source, part-time, full-time, itinerant or contracted/hired status.

Of the Licensed Staff in this role - Number Certified= This is a subset of the total number of licensed personnel for each role. This indicates either HR category (e.g., Professional Educator, Student Services Personnel) and/or specialty certification (e.g., Certified in Adapted Physical Education or National Board Certified).

FTE of Licensed Staff= Calculated full time equivalency of all licensed personnel this role– **use Number of "Licensed Staff in this role" field to calculate FTE**

Number of Not Licensed Staff in this role= This is the total number of not licensed personnel hired to work in this role regardless of funding source, part-time, full-time, itinerant or contracted/hired status.

Number of Direct Hire Staff= Of the total number of personnel licensed and/or certified, how many are directly hired (part-time, full-time and/or itinerant) by the district?

Number of Contracted Staff= Of the total number of personnel licensed and/or certified, how many are contracted (part-time, full-time and/or itinerant) by the district?

Lowest Salary or Hourly Wage= For this role, what is the lowest wage paid? Include only the Salary/Hourly Wage, not including additional benefits.

NC State Board of Education General Licensure Requirements

Definitions

Professional Educator or Educator – An administrator, teacher, or student services personnel

Teacher – An individual whose major responsibility is to either teach or directly supervise teaching, as classified by the North Carolina State Board of Education (NCSBE).

Student Services Personnel – An individual providing specialized assistance to students, teachers, administrators, or the education program in general, as classified by the NCSBE. Student services personnel include, but are not limited to, individuals employed in school counseling, school social work, school psychology audiology, speech-language pathology, and media coordination.

1.0 Licensure Required

Any person employed by a Local Education Agency (LEA) in a professional educator position must hold a professional educator's license. Each applicant shall file an application in the form prescribed by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) with the required appropriate supporting documentation and the required processing fee.

Number of personnel: 1

Total hours worked per week ÷ Total hours in work week = FTE 37.5 hours ÷ 37.5-hour work week = 1.0 FTE

Number of personnel: 5

Total hours worked per week x Number of personnel = Total hours worked per week for all full-time personnel in role Total hours worked per week ÷ Total hours in work week = FTE 37.5 hours x 5 personnel = 187.5 187.5 hours worked per week ÷ 37.5-hour work week = 5.0 FTE

For part-time employee serving only EC

Number of personnel: 1 Total hours worked per week ÷ Total hours in work week = FTE 15 hours ÷ 37.5-work week = 0.4 FTE

Number of personnel: 2

Number of hours worked per week x Number of personnel in role Total hours worked per week \div Total hours in work week = FTE 20 hours x 2 audiologists = 40 hours worked per week 40 hours \div 37.5-hour work week = 1.067 (<u>1.07 FTE</u> rounded to the nearest hundredths)

For full-time personnel serving all students (e.g., School Nurses, PE Teachers), apply ADM Calculation

Go to the <u>December 2021 LEA 3-21</u> Report posted on the EC Division site. Convert 3-21 ADM percent to a decimal and use that for each personnel role in this category.

Number of personnel: 5 PE Teachers ADM: 13.8% (0.138 = 0.14 rounded to the nearest hundredths) Number of full-time personnel x ADM = FTE 5 PE Teachers x 0.14 = 0.70 FTE

For part-time personnel serving all students (e.g., School Nurses, PE Teachers, School Social Workers), apply ADM Calculation

Go to the <u>December 2021 LEA 3-21</u> Report posted on the EC Division site. Convert 6-21 ADM percent to a decimal and use that for each personnel role in this category.

ADM: 13.8% (0.138 = 0.14 rounded to the nearest hundredths) Number of personnel serving all students: 2 School Social Workers Number of hours worked per week x Number of personnel in role (Total hours worked per week ÷ Total hours in work week) x ADM = FTE

25 hours x 2 School Social Workers = 50 hours worked per week 50 hours ÷ 37.5-hour work week = 1.333 (1.33 rounded to the nearest hundredths)

 $1.33 \times 0.14 = 0.1862$ (0.19 FTE rounded to the nearest hundredths)

FAQ-Adapted Physical Educator

Q: When I am trying to complete this survey for PE and/or APE teachers, can it be someone with a K-8 special education license or a physical therapist? What if I have a 'general education' PE teacher providing APE? What does certified mean for APE?

A: Only a person with a Physical Education license can provide PE/APE instruction. LEAs/PSUs may have a collaborative approach to providing APE evaluation and services. Please complete the survey to document what personnel are providing these services to students with disabilities (you can use the PE or APE teacher rows to do this, as is appropriate for the way you staff).

A 'general education' licensed PE teacher may provide APE/specialized instruction in the absence of a Certified Adapted Physical Educator (CAPE) to any student with and IEP or 504 plan.

A licensed physical education teacher who is a Certified Adapted Physical Educator (CAPE) and/or has completed additional training in serving SWD with specially designed instruction in the physical education curriculum.

Please make certain no personnel is counted twice.

FAQ-Language Facilitator

Would a full-time language facilitator for a student with a hearing impairment be counted under Speech Language Pathologist?

□ No, however they can be counted as a paraprofessional if they:

(1) provide one-on-one tutoring if such tutoring is scheduled at a time when a student would not otherwise receive instruction from a teacher

(2) assist with classroom management, such as organizing instructional and other materials

(3) provide instructional assistance in a computer laboratory

- (4) conduct parental involvement activities
- (5) provide support in a library or media center
- (6) act as a translator

(7) provide instructional support services under the direct supervision of a teacher.

FAQ- Serving Students Inclusively

Q: The directions say, "if your PE Teacher, school counselor, guidance counselor works with children with disabilities, to calculate the FTE". Is that only if they are providing services such as adapted PE that are listed within a student's IEP? What if they are just seeing them in general (an EC student in PE for their PE block but without adapted PE/Special Education or related services)?

A: A teacher providing APE/Specially Designed Instruction in PE should be counted either as PE or APE teacher regardless of instructional setting of the student (e.g., general education, inclusive and/or pull out instruction). These teachers should be licensed in PE (not K-8 SpEd) and **not be counted twice**. Any teacher holding Certification in Adapted Physical Education (CAPE) should be counted (as a subset of the licensed APE teacher/1st column) in the Certified (2nd) column.

FAQ- Serving Students Inclusively

Q: What about general education teachers who have students with disabilities in their classrooms? Specials teachers, such as Art, PE, Technology, and Spanish teachers? What about if our nurse administers any medication to students with disabilities? Would that time be counted?

A: This report requires you to count/include all staff/personnel who provide special education and/or work with students with disabilities from age 3-21. General Ed teachers, Art and Spanish are not counted

Viewing State Level Personnel Data

Each year, the data submitted from all LEAs, Charters and State Operated Programs comprises the report North Carolina submits to the Office of Special Education Programs.

This report is then <u>posted on the EC Division</u> <u>website</u> if you are interested in reviewing the state level data.
