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11 Districts and 60 Schools Earn North Carolina's Highest Graduation Rates in 2014-15

Eleven school districts and 60 high schools were honored Tuesday by State Superintendent June Atkinson for having the highest four-year cohort graduation rates among all districts and schools in the state in 2014-15.

"I am so proud of the teachers, school counselors, coaches, principals and district leaders, and others who have worked tirelessly to make sure more students are graduating from North Carolina's public schools than ever before. Their dedication and tenacity enabled the state to reach the all-time high graduation rate of 85.6 in 2014-15," said State Superintendent June Atkinson. "As we honor the schools and districts that do an exceptional job keeping students in school and on track for graduation, I am hopeful that these award winners will continue to share best practices and serve as models for districts and schools across the state."

Representatives from the districts and schools were honored and received plaques at a luncheon held in Durham. To receive an award, schools must have been open for at least four years. The full report on the state's cohort graduation rates, as well as previous years' reports, is available <u>online</u>.

AP One-Day Workshops – Registration Due on Friday. Free PD Opportunity

NCAPP is offering scholarships for current AP teachers from your district to attend AP One-Day workshops in October or November. Led by experienced instructors, these regional subjectspecific AP One-Day workshops provide educators with the support and training needed to develop effective strategies for teaching an AP course. Teachers should take note of which AP subjects are available at which workshop on the registration form at the link below, as all subjects are not available at all workshops.

Registration fees will be paid by the Partnership. Districts/schools are eligible to receive up to \$100 substitute reimbursement per teacher who attends (Districts/schools must submit a request for substitute reimbursement funds within 30 days after the workshop; see attached Substitute Teacher Reimbursement form for instructions). **Districts/schools are responsible for travel costs.**

Please note that if a teacher fails to attend the workshop or fails to **cancel his/her registration less than 14 calendar days prior to an event**, <u>the school may be invoiced for the \$205 registration</u> <u>fee</u>. If a teacher is not able to attend, you may send a replacement in the same subject and not be charged, but the teacher will need to register online at the link provided below.
