October 16 Planning Meeting Summary

All charter directors were invited to a meeting on October 16, hosted by Ms. Helen Nance at Gray Stone Day School. This meeting provided an opportunity to discuss with NCDPI leaders and each other the services NCDPI offers to charter schools and how those services could be improved. Dr. Atkinson, Mr. Levinson, Mr. Martez Hill, and Dr. Deanna Townsend-Smith engaged in informal conversation with the 30 or so directors in large and small group gatherings over 4 hours. The directors spent one portion of the meeting discussing how charters could better organize themselves to facilitate peer support and delivery of professional development and training from NCDPI. This constructive discussion produced a number of concrete recommendations that will be distributed to all directors soon, along with suggestions for next steps in moving these ideas forward. ACT Aspire Periodics for C & I Leaders

Below please see a message that was sent to your testing coordinators Tuesday afternoon. Following many comments from the field regarding the difficulty some of you are experiencing in preparing to administer the ACT Periodics diagnostic assessment, we have researched further with ACT. We also are concerned with the unforeseen complexity of the process. The assessment will be available to you and should provide you with valuable information; however, the assessment is now considered optional. We encourage you to make your decision based on the best interest of your LEA, taking into account benefit versus time and resources commitment to make the diagnostic happen.

ACT Aspire Periodics

As a replacement for the ACT Explore, the Department of Public Instruction implemented ACT Aspire Periodics for all students in 8th grade membership for the 2015–16 school year. This decision resolved a cost issue while also providing an 8th grade assessment with information on students' college and career readiness. It was the Department's understanding that the ACT Aspire Periodics assessment would be easily accessible online, and with its flexible administration window would have low impact on instructional time. As many of you have provided feedback on the logistics required for administering this assessment, it has been noted that the administration requirements are beyond the expectations for such an assessment. We have discussed your concerns, as well as our concerns with ACT, and after much consideration have concluded it is best to offer ACT Aspire Periodics as an option, not as a requirement for the 2015–16 school year. If local capacity supports the administration of the ACT Aspire Periodics, we encourage districts to proceed as planned.
