#### Office of Charter Schools Updates

 Adam Levinson's, Interim Director, OCS Changes Announcement

The Office of Charter Schools (OCS) has recently realigned its work in order to more efficiently and effectively meet the needs of the State Board and the NC charter schools community. Most of the OCS functions you have come to expect – such as administering the Application, Planning Year, Amendment, Renewal, and Closure processes – will continue in much the same form, and OCS will still provide information and technical assistance regarding how to meet all state and federal requirements. The way we do this may seem different, however, as we have moved to a more streamlined, focused operation. Some of the highlights include the following:

OCS will no longer assign consultants to be the single point of contact for each charter school; instead, OCS will provide services to the charter community based on areas of work (such as Applications, RTO, and Amendments), with a lead/primary contact for each.

OCS also will no longer visit each school annually; as part of our new work stream focused on "Risk Assessment," schools will only receive site visits as needed to address high risk issues or if required by the Renewal process.

OCS has begun consolidating communications from various areas of DPI into a weekly newsletter to charter administrators.

OCS is redesigning the Charter Schools website to be more user-friendly and increase transparency regarding charter school law, policy, and operations.

While we recognize that there will be some growing pains as we transition to this new way of working, we are confident that this approach will enable us to provide the best service to the State Board, Charter School Advisory Board, and schools that we can within our limited resources.

#### Teacher of the Year (TOY) Process

The Teacher of the Year applications are due on October 2, 2015 at 5:00PM. Information submitted after this date will not be considered. Please make sure you submit your packets electronically as one complete PDF document. The selection committee will review submitted portfolios and select five candidates to interview. Ultimately, two finalists will be selected, and the committee will conduct school visits for those two teachers. The Charter Teacher of the Year will then be determined, and that teacher will participate in the state Teacher of the Year process, along with eight Regional Teachers of the Year from across the state. #### School Performance Grade Posting Requirements

All schools must place the School's Performance Grade in a prominent position on the school's website. Schools that received a "D" or "F" must send a letter of notification to all families attending the school. The Office of Charter Schools will collect this evidence on a future date. The general statute is outlined below for your reference.

#### § 115C-218.65. North Carolina School Report Cards.

A charter school shall ensure that the report card issued for it by the State Board of Education receives wide distribution to the local press or is otherwise provided to the public. A charter school shall ensure that the overall school performance score and grade earned by the charter school for the current and previous four school years is prominently displayed on the school Web site. If a charter school is awarded a grade of D or F, the charter school shall provide notice of the grade in writing to the parent or guardian of all students enrolled in that school.
