Due to the small number of EXTEND1 students in our district resulting in fewer than 5 students tested in many subgroups, analyzing the overall numbers tested provides a clearer picture of possible disproportionality. For reading, math and science in grades 3-8, it was determinted that African-American males are over-represented in EXTEND1 assessments when compared with the district.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:

A district team will review EXTEND1 documentation annually for possible recommendations of excelling students who may be more appropriately challenged by the SCOS; Exceptional Children's Department will conduct self-audits with internal compliance measures to assure students are identified appropriately; District implementation continues for MTSS/PBIS.
