## 1.0 Percent Participation Justification Form 2017–18

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires each district and charter school to complete and submit a justification when it anticipates exceeding 1.0 percent of students assessed in a subject area with the NCEXTEND1 alternate assessment. Justifications from each district and charter school will be reviewed by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), and follow up actions will be determined based on the information found in the justification document. Teachers are trained on the requirements for student eligibility to be administered the Alternate Assessment for any tested area.

Beginning the 2017-18 school year, Compliance Checks for ALL IEPs created throughout the school year are conducted to assure all components of the DEC forms were completed with accuracy and contained all required components. Testing Administration and Testing Accommodations are part of these compliance checks.

Clay County Schools Exceptional Children Program conducts staff trainings at least 5 times per year where compliance is reviewed and teachers are trained in areas where non-compliance has been noted.

  - Description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined:

Disproportionality in Clay County Schools as it pertains to administration of the statewide Alternative Assessments is defined as an unusually high number of students in a specific category determined eligible to participate in the EXTEND 1 Alternative Assessment. Because the number of students in each category are so small, this is analyzed on a case-by-case basis to determine whether eligibility requirements were considered and met in the IEP process throughout the student's educational services in our district.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:

Any time a student is considered for eligibility for an Alternative Assessment, the IEP Team must discuss the required components for student eligibility for administration of an Alternative Assessment. The EC Director conducts Compliance Audits on ALL IEPs in the district and checks to assure compliance of required components is met for Alternative Assessments. If there appears to be a disproportionate percentage in a particular category, the EC Director will analyze the data for each student to determine the eligibility of the students and if noncompliance is found, the director will conduct additional training on these requirements.

4. Enter additional justification of variables not covered but deemed essential to understanding why the district/charter school has a higher rate of alternate assessment participation.

Clay County Schools is a small LEA with a total enrollment of 1,303 students in Preschool through 12th grade for the 2016-17 school year. The average class size for students in grades required to participate in statewide assessments was 99 students. Just one student eligible to take an Alternate Assessment would equate more than 1% of the student population taking any statewide assessment. Of the 1,303 students enrolled, a total of 10 students participated in the EXTEND 1 Alternate Assessment for their grade level. Reporting shows that more than 1.0% of the student population participated in the EXTEND 1 Alternate Assessment in grades 5, 7, and 11. Grade 5 had two students out of a total of 110 students participate in the EXT 1 testing. Grade 7 had three students out of a total of 104 students participate in the EXT 1 testing. Grade 11 had 3 students out of a total of 95 students participate in the EXT 1 testing. Due to the extremely small number of students enrolled in our district, just one student will effect our rate of students taking any statewide assessment in regards the breakdown looking at race, ethnicity, and disability.
