2. Columbus County Schools follows the NC Testing Guidelines, provided by NCDPI, for determining the eligibility for participating in the alternate assessment. We verify that the student has a current IEP, is enrolled in grades 3-8, 10, or 11, according to PowerSchool, the student is instructed using the North Carolina Extended Content Standards in all assessed content areas, and the student has a significant cognitive disability. This disability is determined by the IEP team identifying students whose disability impacts their adaptive behaviors and requires extensive and repeated individualized instruction and support to make meaningful gains.

Columbus County Schools also employees a full-time Compliance Specialist that reviews Extend I determination and eligibility requirements. Verification of all students fall within federal and state guidelines that govern children with disabilities. Our staff members are provided with training to ensure they are knowledgeable of the requirements and procedures

Disproportionality is defined as significant overrepresentation based on race and ethnicity within an educational setting, eligibility identification or disciplinary sanctions as outlined in NC 1505-3.6 (a). Columbus County Schools does have some areas of disproportionality as identified by the data from the Extend I results from the 2016-2017. The students that were administered the Extend I assessments met the guidelines established by the Policies Governing Services For Children With Disabilities.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:

Disproportionality will continue to be monitored using the guidelines established for identifying students in need of an alternate assessment. Our EC Director and Compliance Specialist will continue to participate in and monitor the identification of students that are place on the alternate curriculum and receive the Extend I assessments.

Columbus County is a small rural county of southeastern North Carolina. Our current April 1 Headcount was 762 EC students from a total ADM of 5959. We closely monitor the number of students on the Extend I curriculum and will continue to follow the guidelines established to govern our EC practices.
