## 1.0 Percent Participation Justification Form 2017–18

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires each district and charter school to complete and submit a justification when it anticipates exceeding 1.0 percent of students assessed in a subject area with the NCEXTEND1 alternate assessment. Justifications from each district and charter school will be reviewed by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), and follow up actions will be determined based on the information found in the justification document. We also employ a compliance specialist that audits EC files to determine if the correct identification has been made according to the published criteria.

Once students age out, some parents have decided to move to our county or to pay tuition to continue their student's education. Some parents choose to come to our county to be able to be in a special program in a regular school setting with non-disabled peers instead of being in a separate school.

Davie County Schools is a small district, with just over 6,000 students, so the smaller sample size results in wider variations of percentages of NCEXTEND1 students from year to year.
