2. Enter a description of how the district/charter school will assure that Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams are adhering to the eligibility criteria as outlined in the Testing Students with Disabilities publication when determining student eligibility for participation in the alternate assessment.

The North Carolina School for the Deaf is a separate school for deaf and hard of hearing students. NCSD follows the enrollment flowchart developed by DPI Exceptional Children's department, requiring an IEP team decision for placement. Therefore, 100% of our student population have an IEP. Of that, 40.78% of our students are deaf/hearing impaired plus an additional disability. This is consistent with the general population of individuals with deafness who have concomitant disabilities.

According to the *Testing Students with Disabilities* manual, students are eligible for EXTEND1 testing if they have an IEP, are enrolled in PowerSchool in applicable grades, are instructed in the Extended Content Standards, and have a significant cognitive disability. Based on these criteria, and NCSD's consistent review of student progress and needs, we are in compliance with guidelines and best practices.



The proportionality of students in EXTEND1 testing is comparable to the overall enrollment in racial and socioeconomic categories.

The IEP teams regularly monitor progress, evaluations, and other pertinent documentation to ensure that all students receive appropriate services with direct communication in high quality programs.

NCSD has a total enrollment of less than 100 students, meaning that even 1 student assessed by NCEXTEND1 would place us over the 1% expectation. As a separate school for students with hearing loss, with enrollment dictated by LEA IEP teams, our EXTEND1 participation is expected to be higher than a traditional school. We encourage high expectations and rigorous coursework for all students, a point of commendation by both AdvancedED and CEASD accreditation boards.
