Many of our students are transferred to our LEA/District from other LEAs from across North Carolina. Many of the transfer students are previously identified SOS, OCS or ECS.

We administer educational evaluations in reading, math, and science using visual language, low vision accommodations and Braille to determine if a student has the ability for SOS, OCS or ECS curriculum. Race or socioeconomic status is not a factor throughout this evaluative process.

ESDB is a highly specialized LEA/District. We have deaf, hard of hearing, blind and visually impaired students as well as students with multiple disabilities including significant cognitive impairment. The disabilities include Battens, Traumatic Brain Injury, Autism, Behavior issues, ambulatory challenges, CP, etc. Because of our special population of students, we will often have more than 1% participation in the ECS or NCEXTEND1 for grades 3 - 8 10, 11.
