Granville County Public Schools will follow the recommendations from the DPI Program Assessment. We will provide Professional Development for principals, so to help them understand when their schools are within the 1% participation to include the gender, race, and socioeconomic groups. The EC Department will provide team leaders with the information needed to help individual teachers with questions for Extended Content. Setting specific PLC's will be added to help teachers focus on the rigor of Extended Content. The EC Director will meet with the Testing Coordinator three times a year to discuss the data.

Description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined:

There is noted disproportionality of males (75%) to females (25%) in the Extended Content. There is also disproportionality amongst males (60%) and females (40%) in the separate setting.

- Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed: The EC Director and the Testing Coordinator will share
 the data with principals and leadership to make them aware of the disproportionality. Through the MTSS and
 EC identification processes, the EC Department will monitor compliance in the identification and identify any
 patterns and report the findings to the principals and district leadership.

 GCPS educates children from two orphanages one of which serves as a short-term respite care facility, in addition to several group homes. Also located in the county is the Murdoch Developmental Center, The Whitaker School, and Central Regional Hospital. All of these care facilities in some way contribute to the elevated numbers of students participating in the program and the Extended Content Area.
