2. - The student has been identified by a formal psycho-educational assessment as having a significant cognitive disability which significantly impacts adaptive behavior and requires extensive and repeated individualized instruction and support to make meaningful gains.
- The student uses substantially adapted materials and individualized methods of accessing information in alternative ways.
- The student is instructed using the North Carolina Extended Content Standards in all assessed content areas (English Language Arts/Reading, Mathematics, and Science)
- The student is enrolled in grades 3-8, 10, or 11 according to PowerSchool.
- 3. Enter a description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined and plans for how that disproportionality will be addressed.
- Disproptionality in the areas of race and gender were identified on the participation data sheet from NCDPI as the areas of concern for Hertford County.
- Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:
 - Beginning at the early elementary stage, students with significant cognitive disabilities will receive small group and intensive instruction to strengthen and remediate academic skills.
 - Early interventions through MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) will be used to pinpoint and remediate significant areas of academic weakness.
 - Students with significant cognitive disabilities will be instructed in the least restrictive environment by a highly effective exceptional children teacher.

- Early intervention programs specifically designed for students with significant cognitive disabilities are not readily available in our area.
