During the 2017-2018 school year, our school tested one 5<sup>th</sup> grader on the NC Extend 1 out of 48 total students and one 7<sup>th</sup> grader out of total 62 students. Due to our population size, this percentage appears disproportionate by exceeding the 1% participation cap.
