The EC Director, and Director of Testing and Accountability review subgroup data to determine if students from any subgroup are more likely to be placed on an EXT1 assessment. Based on current demographics, we do not have more than 30 students on an EXT1 assessment in any grade level or combined subject assessment. Even with a small N size, the LEA is not outside of 1.5 times more likely to take any EXT1 assessment on any combined subject assessment for all groups identified.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:

The EC Compliance Specialist reviews eligibility determinations for all initial referrals and 3 year reevaluations. She will examine EXT 1 criteria and student data to monitor compliance; she will also monitor alternate assessment justification statements on all IEPs for students on EXT1 assessments. The EC department will continue to review and monitor internal processes for identifying students and provide PD annually to teachers and related service providers.
