2. Enter a description of how the district/charter school will assure that Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams are adhering to the eligibility criteria as outlined in the *Testing Students with Disabilities* publication when determining student eligibility for participation in the alternate assessment.

Matthews Charter Academy opened in the 2016-17 school year. The students that are enrolled in the school were all selected from a lottery of students that applied to attend the school. All students being evaluated on the Extend 1 were identified in the school district that they previously were educated. When the school started the first year there were eight students that were following the Extended Content Standards, four being in one grade. Teachers have been trained and are aware of the criteria for participating in the Extend 1 assessment. The teachers are aware of how to access the "Testing Students with Disabilities" on the DPI website. At each IEP the parents were told about the assessment that their child would be participating and participated in making the decision.

Steps that will be taken to address exceeding the 1% participation in the alternate assessment:

- Ensure all teachers, administrators, and related service personnel that serve on IEP teams are trained on the criteria for participating on the Extend 1 alternate assessment.
- Ensure all teachers, administrators, and related service personnel are trained on how to determine if a student educational needs are best met through the Extended Content Standards.
- Create a document that can be given to parents when the decision about statewide assessments.

3. Enter a description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined and plans for how that disproportionality will be addressed.

• Description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined:

The students that are enrolled in Matthews Charter Academy are selected on a lottery basis and when selected, the school is not aware of the race/ethnicity or socioeconomic status of the students. Also, the school does not know if the student has an IEP. Matthews Charter Academy has not been

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identified as having disproportionality. The students that are participating in the Extend 1 this year, are from different racial/ethnic groups.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed: The students are enrolled in Matthews Charter Academy through a nondiscriminatory process.

Matthews Charter Academy is finding that more parents of students with more significant disabilities are applying to the charter school. The first year the school was opened there was a need for a class that taught children on the Extended Content Standards. The number of children with more significant disabilities that are selected through the lottery process is increasing.
