## 1.0 Percent Participation Justification Form 2017–18

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires each district and charter school to complete and submit a justification when it anticipates exceeding 1.0 percent of students assessed in a subject area with the NCEXTEND1 alternate assessment. Justifications from each district and charter school will be reviewed by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), and follow up actions will be determined based on the information found in the justification document. Staff from the Exceptional Children and Accountability Divisions in each district and charter school should collaborate to provide the following information on the justification document. 2. Enter a description of how the district/charter school will assure that Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams are adhering to the eligibility criteria as outlined in the *Testing Students with Disabilities* publication when determining student eligibility for participation in the alternate assessment.

Person County Schools Exceptional Children Programs staff will train school administrators and EC teachers annually on the eligibility criteria for participation in the alternate assessment as outlined in the Testing Students with Disabilities publication. During internal audit/record review processes, EC Program staff will review justification statements for participation in the alternate assessment for alignment with the eligibility criteria. A process will be established, beginning in the 2018-19 school year, for a district staff member to attend IEP meetings in which the team is considering moving a student to the alternate assessment. The district staff will ensure that appropriate data is reviewed to guide decision-making, as well as facilitate discussions regarding the ramifications of taking the alternate assessment.

  - Description of how any disproportionality among race, gender, or socioeconomic status groups is defined:

While disaggregated data will be reviewed for each grade level and tested subject, the District will use the composite ("all") data for reading and math when determining whether there is disproportionality due to the small number of students taking the alternate assessment at each grade. Risk ratios will be calculated for all subgroups with at least 5 students participating in the alternate assessment. If the risk ratio for the subgroup is greater than 3, the district will examine whether there is a research-based reason for the difference and address issues found.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed:

Using the calculation method above, the only subgroup found to have a risk ratio greater than 3 was males. According to the CDC, males are affected by developmental disabilities at twice the rate of females; therefore this is an expected difference. Person County Schools will review records of all students taking the alternate assessment to verify that the student meets the eligibility criteria.

Person County Schools has a small number of students at tested grade levels. The difference between being over and under the 1% at any given grade level ranges from one to four students. The difference between being over and under the 1% for all (reading and math) is ten students.
