At the IEP meetings, parents are informed as to the eligibility criteria for the EXTEND 1 and a part of the decision making.

Also, the school does not know if the student has an IEP. Queens Grant Charter Academy has not been identified as having disproportionality. The students participating in the EXTEND 1 this year are from different racial ethnic groups.

The students are enrolled in Queens Grant Community Charter through a nondiscriminatory process.
