On April 13, 2018, NCDPI provided a memo, Significant Disproportionality/Mandatory Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS), which listed North Carolina Local Education Agencies (LEAs) formally identified with Significant Disproportionality (SD). WCPSS has received warning with SD in two of the three areas assessed: identification and placement. WCPSS monitors data and addresses potential disproportionality areas/concerns by district and by region incorporating a cross team approach for school intervention. IEP team decisions are made on the basis on the unique needs of each student.

Additional focus and reporting will be developed and deployed for the 2018-19 school year.

WCPSS serves over 1,000 students who receive instruction via Extended Content Standards. More than 100 students requiring instruction via Extended Content Standards moved into WCPSS from July – April of SY 2018. It is likely that WCPSS will exceed the 1.0% ceiling at any grade level based on student distribution.
