The EC teachers are provided Professional Development on NCEXTEND 1 Eligibility Criteria. During each IEP team meeting, the team discusses with the parent(s) all assessment types per individual student. Each assessment is eliminated based on the student(s) ability level until an appropriate assessment is matched with the student. The IEP team ensures the student has a significant delayed cognitive ability level. Students that are taught from the Extended Content Standards in ELA, Math, and/or Science based on their IEP, participate in the alternate assessment.

Due to the small number of students within our district vs. the number of EC students within Whiteville City Schools, the numbers can be skewed when analyzing data.

Based on the analysis of the data for 2017-2018, there is a disproportionate number of EC males served in WCS vs. EC females. This disproportionality is reflected in our EXTEND 1 population, as well.

• Plans for how disproportionality will be addressed: Professional Development will be provided to EC Staff and School Administration to explain the data to ensure that sound educational decisions are made based on individual student's needs. 4. Enter additional justification of variables not covered but deemed essential to understanding why the district/charter school has a higher rate of alternate assessment participation. WCS has numerous therapeutic foster homes and group homes within our district. We have registered 14 EC students that were placed in therapeutic foster homes or group homes as of the date this report was completed. In addition, 59 students have moved in for the 2017-2018 school year with existing IEPs. Also, out of the 28 students in WCS that are on the EXTEND 1, 8 students are categorized as Autistic.
