No change in funding formula from prior years

7.38 At Risk Funds / Extended Learning & Integrated Student Supports Grant (Same as House)

\$6m out of the appropriation shall be used for the Extended Learning and Integrated Student Supports Competitive Grant Program. DPI may use up to \$200,000 to administer the program. (Continuation of program from 2017-19)

7.45 School Psychologist Allotment (Senate only)

\$35,368,857(R)

Reduction of Instructional Support Allotment

(\$27,368,857)(R)

Allot the minimum of 1 school psychologist position per LEA. SBE to adopt the formula. No transfers out of this allotment permitted.

No change in funding formula from prior years

7.41 Exceptional Children Transportation Reserve Fund (Senate only)

7.31 NC Classroom Supply Program (language different-Same \$)

- Adds funds to the instructional supplies allotment to fund a program to provide \$300* to each teacher. Existing allotment funds will also be required to fund the program.
- Required for LEAs. Optional for independent public schools and Renewal School System which may opt in by August 1.
- All teachers employed as of August 31, regardless of funding sources, are eligible to participate.
- Program shall be administered by the same administrator as Personal Education savings.

(House *\$145 per teacher. Creates a separate allotment and Requires DPI to determine the allocation per teacher and to train the teachers. Funding is only available to units that participate. Funded with nonrecurring funds)

7.17 Renewal School System -(*Same as House*)

Modifies the funding formula to use the statewide average salary as the conversion rate for Renewal School System (currently only Rowan Salisbury).

7.27 Cooperative Innovative High School (Significant differences)

\$1,510,000(R)

- Newly approved CIHS receive supplemental funding for the first three years of operation only. Supplemental funding allocations will continue to be based on the economic tier designation of the LEA. (Tier 1: \$275,000; Tier 2: \$200,000; Tier 3: \$180,000)
- CIHS supplemental funding reduced and phased out over three years:
 - For CIHS that received supplemental funding prior to the 2017-18 fiscal year,
 DPI shall phase out the allotment as follows
 - **2019-20 100%**
 - **2**020-21 50%

House: No additional appropriation. Caps the number of CIHS that the SBE may approve with funding to 4 for each school year. Approves Halifax early College HS and Stanly STEM EC to operate without supplemental funding but with community college FTE funding. SBE may approve CIHS without funding, however the CIHS is not eligible for supplemental allotment or community college FTE.

7.9 Advanced Teaching Roles (Differences - same \$)

Modifies General Statute to include Advanced Teaching Roles Grant (no longer a pilot program). SBE shall establish a program to develop advanced teaching roles and organizational models that link teacher performance and professional growth to salary increases for teachers in selected LEAs. Establishes specific qualifications for which teachers may be considered. Salary supplement up to 30% of the State salary schedule.

Allows grant funds to be used for supplements . Does not provide class size flexibility. Total appropriation \$2m.in both House and Senate

House: Provides class size flexibility. Funds shall not be used for supplements, but the approved LEAs may use any State source of funds for supplements. SBE may approve LEAs without funding.

7.36 School Safety Grants (Similar language different \$)

Modifies General Statute to include the school mental health grants and SRO grants only.

Report to the JLEOC on unpaid meals in LEAs.

Funds to provide school lunches at no cost to students qualifying for reduced price meals in all NSLP schools.

7.18 Economic & Financial Literacy (Same language - different \$)

\$1,063,800(NR)

Requires a full credit course on Economics and Personal Finance for high school graduation (includes independent public schools). Funds for a grant to the NC Council on Economic Education for professional development to teachers. (House \$900,000)

7.42 Read to Achieve Reading Camp Curriculum Pilot (Senate only)

\$70,000(NR)

Within funds appropriated to DPI, the department shall acquire Imagine Learning and Failure Free Reading for the reading camp curriculum. One or more LEAs shall be selected to use the curriculum. Reporting requirement.

7.44 Innovative Signature Career Academy Pilot (Senate only)

\$1,500,000(NR)

Pilot to be implemented in Guilford County Schools for reforming its current CTE program.

Iredell Statesville South Iredell HS – (Senate only)

75,000(NR)

Construction of a barn for FFA program

7.49 NC Hospitality Education Foundation (Senate only)

\$200,000(NR)

A grant to the Education Foundation of the NC Restaurant and Lodging Association to be used to provide certified CTE programs focused on the hospitality sector. Match of 1 State:1 non State funds. Reporting requirement.

7.48 Repeal Right of Action/Capital Outlay Fund (Senate only)

Modifies G.S. 115C-431 to state that if an agreement can not be met in mediation, the decision of the county commissioners is final. No legal action may be taken.

39.2 Capital Improvement and repairs and Renovations Appropriations

Provides more specificity to the Senate's plan in SB 5 on the use of the State Capital Infrastructure Fund (SCIF) by delineating how much each of the LEAs will receive of the \$1.67 billion.

States that the allocation of these funds will be through 2028-29 (ten years).

4.3(a) Lottery Funds for Needs Based Public School Capital Fund

8.5 UNC Lab School modification (Same as House with exception)

Requires LEA to provide transportation to the Lab school including homeless. This requirement is regardless of the policies applied to the other students in the LEA and extends to providing transportation for extracurricular and field trips.

Requires the LEA to bear the cost of providing school nutrition to the Lab school students House - Reduces total number of Lab schools from 9 to 6

8A.6 Modify NC Teaching Fellows Program (differences)

Expand the program from 5 to 8 institutions. (House and Senate) \$\$600,000 provided to fund 2,200 for each program to provide mentoring and coaching support to forgivable loan recipients, prioritizing to those teachers in low performing schools. (Senate only)

8A.10 Repeal the Transfer of Administration of the Transforming Principal Prep Program to the Principal Fellows Commission.

7.7 Weighted Student Funding Formula

\$1,000,000(NR)

Provides funding for the SBE to contract through a RFP with an independent research organization to perform an evaluation of the State's system for funding public schools and propose an alternative.

7.8 Cybersecurity and Risk Management

\$550,000 (R)

Provides funds to expand School Connectivity initiative to include cybersecurity and risk management services supporting LEAs and charters.

7.10 Digital Learning Plans/Program Funds

\$700,000 (R)

Funds to accelerate the implementation of the State's Digital Learning Plan. 2018-19 Funds Carry forward. 2018-19 appropriation \$6.2m. 2019-20 appropriation \$4.7m

7.12 Principal Allotment

Changes requirement for schools that open after July 1, 2011 to receive a state funded principal to require both 7 state funded teachers and 100 final ADM. Currently, if open after to July 1, 2011 schools must have 100 ADM or more, regardless of FTE.

7.14 Teach for America Reporting requirement

Modifies reporting requirement of TFA in GS120-70.84

7.16 Ensure Sufficient Staffing for Public Schools

Prevents LEAs changing school calendars once adopted except under certain conditions Modifies personal leave for teachers including:

A request for personal leave shall not be approved on any day when students are scheduled to be in regular attendance unless the availability of a substitute for that teacher is confirmed for that day.

7.19 "Upstart" - Virtual Early Leaning Pilot Program

\$1,000,000(NR)

Establishes a 3-year pilot for virtual early learning for at risk preschool age children.

RFP to contract with a 3rd party to deliver services.

10 LEAs selected for the pilot.

Funding shall be divided equally among LEAs selected, regardless of size.

7.20 Reading Diagnostic Assessments

SBE shall approve no fewer than 3 different assessment instruments by 3 different vendors.

7.21 Innovative School District (ISD) - Funds shall not revert

7.22 Modernize Selection of Instructional Materials

- Renames Textbook and Digital Resources to Instructional Materials.
- Defines instructional materials and supplemental materials- broadening the items that can be purchased under the allotment.
- Requires each LEA to select and adopt instructional materials at each instructional level. including having experts evaluate, have written procedures on the selection. No longer a responsibility of the State Textbook Commission.
- Require a public hearing before changing health and safety programs.
- Requires the LEA to publish on the LEA web site the title, author and publisher of all materials purchased.
- Require LEAs to notify parents of students in health & safety programs the entire curriculum and materials.
- Requires LEAs to allow parents to opt out of health & safety programs.
- Requires LEAs to establish a local community media advisory committee to investigate and evaluate challenges from parents, teachers and the public re: unfit materials.
- Allows allotment to be used for rental of textbooks.

7.23 15 point scale for school performance

In calculating the overall school grade - achievement score shall account for 51% and the school growth shall account for 49% (currently 80/20).

Grades shall be on a 15 point scale.

7.24 Program Enhancement Teacher (PET) Allotment – Arts Requirement

- Changes the allotment ratio for PET to be 1 teacher per K-12 ADM at 1:140 (currently 1:191 K-5 ADM). Phase in period remains the same.
- When fully funded in 2021-22, Classroom Teacher allotment is restricted to non PET and may not be transferred out, including to be used for PET.
- SBE is provided the authority to move positions between categories to allocate the available positions between PET and regular teachers.
- Includes dual language classes in the definition of program enhancement these teachers will be restricted to the PET allotment in 2021 onwards.

Arts Education

SBE shall modify State graduation requirement beginning with students entering 6^{th} grade in 2022 to include one required credit in arts education to be completed any time in grades 6^{th} through 12^{th} grade.

7.25 Eliminates Report to Superintendent on the Adopted Schedule of Fees

Replaces the reporting requirement with requiring the LEAs to publish a schedule of fees, charges and solicitations approved on the LEA website by October 15 each year and within 30 days of revision.

7.26 Authorizes SBE appointment authority over an additional position

Adds a position to the SBE – Legislative and Community Affairs Director

7.28 Authorize the NC CTE Education Foundation to Administer Certain Grants

Requires the Commission to work in collaboration with the North Carolina Career and Technical Education Foundation regarding Education and Workforce Innovation Program.

7.29 DDC/CRC Grant Program

Unexpended funds from the Community Residential Center Funds, Developmental Day centers and from the Special State Reserve shall not revert but shall be transferred to a reserve to establish a grant program for community residential centers and developmental day centers. LEAs are not eligible for the grant.

7.30 CTE Adjunct Instructors/Iredell-Statesville Schools

Iredell Statesville Schools may contract with an individual to serve as an adjunct instructor for a specific CTE cluster.

7.32 Robotics Program for Students with Autism

\$ -

DPI shall use available funds up to \$300,000 to implement a program for students with autism that uses interactive facially expressive humanoid robotics for social and behavioral skills development for advanced treatment of autism.

7.33 REAL School Gardens

\$700,000(NR)

Establish a pilot program to transform teaching practices and create outdoor learning labs on school campuses. Pilot for 10 rural school wide Title I elementary schools. Funds for a grant to REAL School Gardens of Carolinas to provide teacher with tools & training to implement effective experiential lessons outdoors.

7.34 Competency Based Math Pilot

\$500,000(NR)

5 year pilot program with DPI to allow students in all grades to advance to higher levels of math courses contingent upon the mastery of concepts and skills rather than upon awarding course credit. Funding for administration and evaluation of the pilot. Funds do not revert until the end of the pilot.

7.35 Life Changing Experiences School Pilot Program

\$ 360,000(NR)

Project for students in grades 6-11 in Lincoln, McDowell, Mitchell and Pill County Schools. Project consists of traveling 3 dimensional, interactive, holistic and evidence-based multimedia education in school programs. Goal is to increase positive intentions and behavioral outcomes.

7.37 Schools that Lead

DPI shall contract with Schools That Lead to provide professional development to teachers and principals in up to 75 schools. Current appropriation \$350K.

8.3 College Advising Corps/College Advisers in Public Schools (House only)

The Board of Governors shall provide a grant to National College Advising Corps to support an expansion of the placement of college advisers in NC Public schools over a 3 year period. Tier 1 and 2 are the focus for the first 2 years of the program.

Advanced Data Analytics

\$200,000(R)

Funds to establish a data analytics section within DPI Increase funding to \$1.2m recurring in 2020-21.

Governors School \$800,000(R)

Additional funding. Total appropriation \$1.6m

Computer Science Plan

\$1,250,000(NR)

Provides funding for Phase 2 of the State Computer Science Plan. Total appropriation \$2m

Advanced Placement Partnership

\$150,000 (R)

Provides training opportunities for teachers of AP and IB courses. The net appropriation is \$2.4m.

Eastern NC STEM \$400,000(NR)

Contract to administer a residential STEM enrichment program for students in select counties. Keeps the funding level the same as 2018-19.

BEGINNINGS \$500,000(R)

Grant for Parents of Children Who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing Inc. Total Appropriation \$1.5m

Muddy Sneakers \$500,000(NR)

Supports experiential learning programs for 5th graders. (increases 2018-19 funding by \$100K)
