



G.S. 130A-155(c)	
<ul> <li>ALL North Carolina children must be compliant with immunization law.</li> <li>Principal/headmaster is required to exclude students not in compliance after the 30th calendar day from the first day of school.</li> </ul>	-

• <u>G.S. 130A-440</u>	
• <u>Health Assessment</u> required for <u>all students new</u> to NC public schools within 30 calendar days of a child's first day of attendance in the public	
schools • Principal/headmaster shall not permit the child to attend the school until	
the required health assessment transmittal form has been presented NOT allowed to impact student's academics

Required by Statute: Garrett's Law Notifications
G.S. 115C-47     8 115C-218.75. General operating requirements - information about meningococcal meningitis and influenza and their vaccines at the beginning of every school year. This information shall include the causes, symptoms, and how meningococcal meningitis and influenza are spread and the places where parents and guardians may obtain additional information and vaccinations for their children.  Grades 5-12 - charter schools to provided information at the beginning of the school year to parents and guardians with information about cervical cancer, cervical dysplasia, human papillomavirus, and the vaccines available to prevent these diseases. This information shall include the causes and symptoms of these diseases, how they are transmitted, how they may be prevented by vaccination, including the benefits and possible side effects of vaccination, and the places parents and guardians my obtain additional information. Require "anyone performing even one test, including waived procedures, on "...human specimens for the purpose of providing information for the diagnosis, prevention, or treatment of any disease or impairment of, or the assessment of the health of a human being..." to register for a CLIA certificate of waiver
