- 270 Reviews Completed YTD in 2022
- 188 Projects Currently Under Review
- Normal Review Cycle is 2-to-4 Weeks
- Current Backlog is 4-to-6 Weeks

- New Schools
  - 131 New Schools 111,156 Students
- Additions
  - 312 Schools
    - 2,045 Classrooms
    - 99 Gymnasiums
    - 59 Cafeterias
    - 39 Media Centers
- Renovations
  - 1,594 Schools
- School Replacement
  - 83 Schools

- Construction Costs Integrated into FNS Database
- 2020 Cost Data = \$250 / SF for New Facilities
  - 2015 = \$194 / SF
  - 2010 = \$138 / SF
- FNS based on pre-pandemic Construction Costs
- Calculations do not reflect recent market volatility



- 2021 to 2025 = \$12.79 Billion
- 2026 to 2030 = \$8.83 Billion

# **Lottery Capital Funds**

- Public School Building Capital Fund (1987)
  - Original Funding Corporate Tax Revenue
  - \$100 Million / Year
  - ADM-Based Allotment
- Needs-Based Public School Capital Fund (2017)
  - Joint Application Process
  - Critical Facility Needs
  - Local Matching Funds
- Public School Repair & Renovation Fund (2021)
  - \$30 Million / Year 1 ..... \$50 Million / Year 2 onward
  - Equal Allocation to 100 Counties
  - Repair, Renovation, Expansion of Classroom Facilities



# NBPSCF (2021 Changes)

- SL 2021-180 (State Budget)
  - Creates Article 38B in G.S. 115C
  - Significant Changes to the NBPSCF
- Increases Maximum Grants
  - \$30 million Elementary Schools
  - \$40 million Middle Schools
  - \$50 million High Schools
- Broadens Eligible Uses
  - New Buildings, Additions, Repairs, and Renovations
- Revises Local Matching Requirement
  - Range from 0% to 35%



# NBPSCF (2021 Changes)

- Changes Eligibility Criteria
  - Adjusted Market Value of Taxable Real Property
  - NC Department of Revenue (data source)
- Eliminates 5-year ineligibility for PSBCF
  - ADM-Based Allotments resumed FY21-22 Q2 Funds
- Eliminates 5-year restriction to re-apply NBPSCF
  - Priority for applicants with no grant in past 3 years
- Prior NBPSCF recipients may apply for increase
  - Project not yet under construction
  - DPI <u>shall</u> prioritize these applications
- Agreement / Reporting Requirements unchanged



# NBPSCF

- Application Evaluation Criteria
  - Prior recipients applying for an increase.
  - Counties designated as Tier 1 areas.
  - Counties with greater need and less ability to generate tax revenue.
  - Counties with a high debt-to-tax revenue ratio.
  - Projects that address critical deficiencies.
  - Projects with new construction or complete renovation.
  - Projects that consolidate two or more schools.
  - Counties that have not received a grant in three years.
  - Start date of project construction.
  - Percentage of District ADM served.



# NBPSCF

- Grant Awards Since Program Inception
  - \$ 30 million in 2017 4 Grants (4 counties)
  - \$ 141 million in 2018 13 Grants (12 counties)
  - \$ 73 million in 2019 6 Grants (6 counties)
  - \$ 115 million in 2020 14 Grants (9 counties)
  - \$ 395 million in 2021 42 Grants (28 counties)
- Anticipated Funding FY2022-23 Grant Cycle
  - \$ 208,252,612 (appropriation in SL 2022-74)
  - \$ 100,000,000 (Needs-Based Capital Reserve per SL 2022-74)
  - \$ 123,000,000 (\*excess net lottery revenue per GS 18C-164)
  - <u>\$ (134,797,544)</u> (directed grants per SL 2022-74)
  - **\$ 296,455,068** Total (\*excess lottery revenue TBD)

## PSBRRF

- Established in SL 2021-180 (State Budget)
- Codified in G.S. 115C-546.16
- Public School Repair & Renovation Fund
  - \$30 Million / Year 1 ..... \$50 Million / Year 2 onward
  - Equal Allotment to 100 Counties
  - Procedures Similar to Annual Lottery (PSBCF)
- Eligible Expenditures
  - Repair, Renovation, Expansion of <u>Classroom</u> Facilities
  - Planning / Design / Construction
- Not Eligible
  - Debt Service Payments
  - Central Administration, Transportation Facilities



# K-12 Athletic Facility Grants

- Established in SL 2021-180 (State Budget)
  - State Capital Infrastructure Fund (SCIF)
  - \$44 million for K-12 Athletic Facility Grants
- OSBM Administered Grants
  - \$31.376 million
  - Grants to 16 LEAs
  - Specific Amounts for Specific Named Projects
- DPI Administered Grants
  - \$12.624 million
  - Grants to 99 LEAs
  - Repairs & Renovations to Existing Athletic Facilities



# K-12 Athletic Facility Grants

- Administrative Requirements
  - LEA-DPI Grant Agreement
  - Project Scope & Budget Statement
  - Quarterly, Annual, and Final Reporting
- SCIF Grant Governance
  - SL 2021-180
  - SL 2021-189
  - GS 143C-6-22
  - 9 NCAC Subchapter 3M.0205
  - SBE Policy



# ESSER Funding (COVID)

- State Law <u>AND</u> Federal Law Compliance
  - Scope of Work Identified in CCIP Application (NCDPI)
  - Federal Impact Aid Program (EDGAR)
  - Federal Procurement Rules 2 CFR 200.318 to 200.326
  - NC General Statutes Design, Construction, Schools
- Funding Expiration
  - ESSER I 9/30/2022
  - ESSER II 9/30/2023
  - ESSER III 9/30/2024
