ESSER II & III (PRC 171, 172, 178 & 181)

 If applications were submitted and approved in FY2021, then applications need to be copied over in CCIP for FY2022 and a carryover budget submitted by July 30, 2021.

*PRC 178 carryover budget only due if applied in FY2021.

- Application amendments and budget amendments will be completed periodically as needed in CCIP through 2023/2024 periods of availability.
- If these PRCs were NOT applied for in FY2021, then the applications with corresponding budgets are due by September 30, 2021.


