Juice was not immediately available for residents. Juice was only provided after residents had consumed water from their cup. All meal components must be provided to residents as part of the reimbursable meal as requested by the Offer v. Serve waiver for Eckerd camps. Table leader counselors and the School Nutrition employees have not received Offer Versus Serve (OVS) waiver training. All meal components must be provided to each student. This facility does not participate in OVS. Servers and other staff directly involved in					
meal preparation and service must understand what meal components and quantities must be served for claiming federal reimbursement.
