The items that need to be included or revised in the current LWP are listed below: Page 1: Nutrition Education 6760.2: Add Promotion to the heading making it Nutrition Education & Promotion Page 3: Under Nutrition Guidelines 5051.4: -Replace the wording "applicable current federal and state nutritional guidelines" to "Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 and Smart Snack Standards". Page 4: Under School Meals # 6760.4.1.2 - add "Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act 2010" in place of "federal statutes and regulations." Page 7: Under Activities to Promote Wellness # 6760.5.6 - Food cannot be used as a reward. # 6760.5.13 - Add Smart Snack Standards to end of the sentence. Page 8: Under Monitoring & Review of Policy Include a statement that says stakeholders, writing out each one, will be a part of the implementation, planning and monitoring of the local wellness policy, how the public will be made aware of the wellness policy and the assessment and the frequency of the assessments (every 3 years is required).
