Finding Detail: The meal counts by category for breakfast and lunch were not correctly compiled prior to filing the February 2017 claim for reimbursement. One day of participation was inadvertently omitted from the claim. The claim was revised during the Administrative Review to include the missing meals. The 2016-2017 electronic Application in the School Nutrition Technology System must reflect current operations at the school site. During the Administrative Review, two areas were noted in the site application requiring correction. The areas are noted below: In question 11, the adult meal price is incorrectly stated as \$2.65; however, adults are charged a la carte prices for food items. The adult price should be listed as zero (0). Question B6, indicates inaccurately that twelfth (12th) grade does not participate in Offer versus Serve (OVS) for breakfast. The check box should indicate participation.
