<p>Finding Detail: One (1) student was approved for free meal benefits but no household income or other records were on file to document how the eligibility status was determined. Finding 2: Two (2) household application was incorrectly classified for meal benefits. Both applications were erroneously classified as eligible for reduced-price meal benefits; upon review of benefits issuance documents, the application was determined to be in error and was changed to denied meal status. Finding 3: Eight (8) students were approved for free meal benefits based on direct certification; upon review of the State Agency Direct Certification System, these students could not be located, and the student’s status was changed to denied meal benefits. Finding 4: One (1) students was classified as denied meal status; however, the child’s name appears on the McKinney Vento (Other Categorically Eligible Students) listing. The child’s status was immediately change to free meal status. A reclaim for eligibility certification and benefit issuance errors for breakfast meals served will be assessed in the amount of \$290.22 and \$11.70 in State Breakfast Reimbursement. A reclaim for eligibility certification and benefit issuance errors for lunch meals served will be assessed in the amount of \$806.20.</p>
