The Chief Financial new to the LEA, is aware of this indiscretion and has taken steps to rectify, ensuring that the a refunds are filed annually. For the fiscal years 2015-2016, 2016-2017, 2017-2018, and 2018- School Nutrition Program is due a total of \$12,211.21 in sales tax refunds.
