Finding Detail: In review of production records for D. F. Walker School, recording errors were noted in section one (1) for recording of holding temperatures. Proper recording of these temperatures is vital to ensure students receive safe meals. Recording errors were also noted in the amount available and served calculations of the D F Walker School production records. It is difficult to determine if each student received the required ½ cup of fruit at breakfast as required by the School Breakfast Program meal pattern requirements due to no onsite visits.						
		Offer versus Serve (OVS) (provision that allows students to decline some of the food components offered) – Validation of the SFA's compliance with OVS requirements, if applicable				
Finding Detail: In review of production records from Chowan Middle School, it appears that the calculations indicate that every student receiving a reimbursable meal at breakfast is given two (2) servings of fruit. Offer Versus Serve provision is not being properly implemented.
