Finding Detail: Production records from the review period (February 2024 and March 2024) indicated multiple days with zero food items in the discard column, while all items were documented in the leftover column. This created the impression that no food items were discarded and that leftovers were kept to be served at a later date. Additionally, leftovers are not being transferred from the paper production record to the computer production record, resulting in inconsistencies in reports.
