This recipe did not contribute to satisfying the weekly grain requirement for the K-5 meal pattern. Only seven (7) ounce grain equivalent was offered for those weeks. The K-5 meal pattern requires a minimum of eight (8) ounce					
grain equivalent to be offered for the week. Finding Detail 3: On the day of review at breakfast, only fat free chocolate milk was served. Fluid milk must be low-fat (1% milk fat or less) or fat-free (unflavored or flavored). At least two types of milk must be offered at each meal. Milk may be unflavored or flavored provided that unflavored milk is offered at each meal service. Milk must be pasteurized fluid milk that meets State standards.
