Finding 2 (Local Wellness Policy): The triennial assessment of the district Local Wellness Policy (LWP) was due by June 30, 2023. As of the date of the review, September 23, 2024, the LWP triennial assessment has not been completed.				
Finding (Milk Variety): In the review of invoices and meal observation, the school is ordering 2% white milk. Only fat free flavored/unflavored and 1% flavored/unflavored milk may be offered to students at breakfast and lunch.				
Finding (State Policies): Per the agreement with the State Agency for 2024-2025 school years (section B3.j), the school will provide sufficient meal periods that are long enough to give all students adequate time to consume breakfast or a minimum of fifteen (15) minutes of seat time to consume breakfast. The reviewer observed on the day of review (September 25, 2024), students only had 7-10 minutes of seat time. Breakfast is considered an instructional intervention to help students achieve their academic best.				
Finding (Procurement): Procurement documents for food and supply items purchased were not available for review. All food and supply items purchased using School Nutrition Funds must be competitively procured for program compliance to ensure free and open competition.
