Written procedures are required to ensure consistency with free and open competition among all vendors. Finding 2 (Procurement): An Invitation for Bid (IFB) for food and supplies was awarded for the 2024-2025 school year; however, items not specified on the original bid are being purchased without documentation. Sufficient bid oversight has not been provided. Finding (Program Monitoring, Self-Assessment): Charter Schools operating the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and the School Breakfast Program (SBP) are required to conduct two program self-assessments of the meal counting and claiming systems used to document the service or reimbursable meals to students before November 1, and April 1 annually. The first self-assessment in the 2023-2024 school year due before November 1, 2023, was not completed by the School Food Authority.
