Finding Detail: A review of all foods and beverages sold by the School Nutrition Program identified one (1) ice cream product that did not meet Smart Snacks Nutrition Standards. The Strawberry Shortcake bar's calories from fat exceeds thirty-five percent (35%) and calories from saturated fat are not less than ten percent (10%).

Other – Procurement

Finding Detail: According to Federal procurement policy, records of the public bid opening for the dairy, bakery, food and supplies, beverage, and ice cream bids, including a sign-in sheet, are required; however, no such record was found. Finding 2: The following required language was missing from the Invitation for Bid (IFB) for dairy, bakery, food and supply items documentation: Procedures for bid proposal protest form for bid certification, Original signatures of authorized purchasers, Clean Air/Water Act, Provision to comply with the Iran Divestment Act of 2015. Finding 3: The School Food Authority has not updated the Procurement Plan since October 2017. The NC Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) Office of School Nutrition’s has a sample Procurement Plan that should be reviewed for updated state and federal bid language. Finding 4: The food distributor is violating the general terms and agreement of the current food and supply bid contract. The bid was awarded based on the bottom-line best price, but the food distributor is charging a fixed fee per case instead. This is not consistent with the bid requirements.
