Overview of Master's Program

The Master of Education Program is designed for currently licensed teachers seeking to expand professional knowledge and skills in curriculum and instruction at the elementary level. The program has been redesigned to ensure candidates are prepared for the ever-changing landscape of public education. The Master of Education Program emphasizes student and teacher achievement through development of research-based competencies in teaching literacy, the Common Core, and 21st Century Skills. With completion of the 36-hour curriculum, the program leads to the master's degree in elementary education with a focus on literacy. This program facilitates the attainment of the revised (2014) National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification for candidates who choose to participate.

Special Features of Master's Program

The program is designed to be completed with part-time enrollment for five semesters, with the program rotation beginning in the fall of 2014. All courses are offered as evening or summer classes at the MHU Adult & Graduate Studies Asheville Center on Airport Road.
