Overview of Master's Program

Winston-Salem State University (WSSU) offers the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree with concentrations in Middle Grades Education and Special Education, and the post-baccalaureate certificate for Add-on Licensure in English as a Second Language. The Middle Grades Education and Special Education concentrations of the MAT provide both initial and advanced licensure while the post-baccalaureate certificate provides certification in the teaching of English as a Second Language to individuals that already hold initial teacher licensure. Teacher candidates who complete the Master of Arts in Teaching must meet the North Carolina Professional Teaching requirements for Professional Educator's Initial licensure and advanced licensure requirements of the North Carolina Standards for Graduate Teacher Candidates. The

master's level programs are housed within the Department of Education which is a component of the Faculty of Education, a division of the College of Arts, Sciences, Business and Education. The General Administration of the University of North Carolina and the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction approve all educator preparation programs. The WSSU Educator Preparation Program received NCATE continuing accreditation in 2015.

The program in the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) provides the opportunity for individuals who hold a non-teaching baccalaureate degree to pursue initial licensure in Middle Grades Education or Special Education. The MAT program options include the initial licensure programs in Middle Grades (Mathematics, English/Language Arts, and Science) and Special Education (General Curriculum). The non-teaching baccalaureate degree that candidates bring to this program must be compatible with the teaching licensure area they are pursuing. Candidates who do not have the requisite discipline area coursework must complete the courses in the discipline before being fully admitted to the program.

Special Features of Master's Program

The MAT is a cohort-based program that incorporates pedagogical standards for candidates with limited or no background in P-12 education. This program addresses basic and advanced pedagogical standards established by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and ensures basic competencies in the teaching area. Upon completion of Phase I, candidates who are employed as lateral entry teachers may take Praxis II of the selected teaching area and become eligible for the Professional Educator's Initial License. Candidates who are not lateral entry teachers complete a 15-week internship in a P-12 classroom upon completing all coursework. The MAT is offered in Special Education (General Curriculum) and Middle Grades Education (Mathematics, English/Language Arts, and Science). Candidates who hold the North Carolina Professional Educator's Initial License are eligible to receive licensure at the "Advanced" level upon completion of the requirements for the MAT. The MAT requires a maximum of 39 credit hours. However, prospective candidates who do not meet discipline content requirements must

complete requisite courses in the discipline content area prior to admission to the MAT licensure program.
