### **ECATS Update: Specific Learning Disabilities Worksheet**

Recently, the new SLD Worksheet went live in ECATS. There have been a few ZenDesk tickets regarding one piece of functionality with the form. In particular, the rules of completion require that the user select the areas in which the student demonstrates inadequate achievement (see screenshot below). The question prompting the ZenDesk tickets is: "What are the appropriate steps to take when no areas demonstrate inadequate academic achievement, and the rules of completion will not allow for no areas to remain unselected?"

#### <u>Solution</u>

- 1. If the student does not demonstrate inadequate academic achievement in any of the areas, 1. Check the box for the area(s) of concern identified when the referral was completed.
- Use the Documentation/Summary box to indicate that while of concern at the referral, there is no
  evidence to support that the student is making inadequate academic achievement in the \_\_\_\_\_ area(s).
  Include evidence that supports this statement in the summary.
