Overview of the NC Textbook Adoption Process

§ 115C-85 Defines textbooks

... "textbook" means systematically organized material comprehensive enough to cover the primary objectives outlined in the standard course of study for a grade or course. Formats for textbooks may be print or non-print, including hardbound books, softbound books, activityoriented programs, classroom kits, and technology-based programs that require the use of electronic equipment in order to be used in the learning process.

Non-Print Materials

- Submissions may include web- and subscription-based materials
- Technology-based textbook materials are those basic learning resources that require the availability of electronic equipment.

NC Publisher's Registry

- Only companies on the NC Publisher's Registry maintained by the State Superintendent can participate
- Publisher removed if "undue pressure" is exercised toward:
 - State Board of Education
 - Textbook Commission
 - Textbook Evaluation Advisors
 - NCDPI Staff

Undue Pressure

- "Undue pressure" defined as personal contact to advocate for the selection of a particular book or series of books
- Does not include social contact, presentations or written communication to the Commission for reconsideration or clarification

Textbook Adoption

General Statues § 115C-85 through § 115C-102

SBE Policies TEXT-000 through TEXT-008

Textbook Adoption Process

- DPI content consultants develop the criteria for evaluation and selection
- DPI drafts the Invitation to Submit Textbooks for Evaluation and Adoption in NC
 - procedures publishers must follow
 - timeline for submission
 - criteria for selection
- The SBE (including its legal counsel) approves the Invitation and then it is distributed to Publishers through the NC Publisher's Registry

Textbook Adoption Process

- The Textbook Commission selects the advisors who assist in reviewing bid materials.
- The Textbook Commissioners evaluate bid materials, write reports of their evaluations, and provide a recommended list textbooks to the SBE for approval
- The SBE makes the final decision regarding the list of recommended textbooks for state adoption
- Contracts are executed

SBE, Commission Members, Advisors, NCDPI Staff

Standards of Conduct

- Demonstrate highest standards of personal conduct
- Avoid actual or perceived conflicts of interest
- Avoid solicitation or acceptance of any actual or promise of a favor or reward

Bid Submission Process

Requesting Bid Identification Numbers

- Each submission requires an identification number issued by NCDPI.
- A Google form to request identification numbers must be completed.
- The link to the form will be distributed in a message through the NC Publisher's Registry.

Requesting Bid Identification Numbers

- Identification numbers are alpha-numeric
 - Ex. IPD4000
- The character will be three letters designated by DPI from the Publisher's/Company's name
- The 4000 series of numbers will be the base number for all bids for English Language Development (ELD) materials
- The **7100** series of numbers will be the base number for all bids for social studies

Purpose of the Cost Proposal Form

- The cost proposal form will be used to enter bid information and prices for textbooks.
- Please save the spreadsheet with the following naming convention:

Company Name_2022 Cost Proposal

Ex. IPD Publishing Company_2022 Cost Proposal

Submission Parameters

- Textbook materials may be submitted for any grade level or course the Publisher deems appropriate.
- Cost proposals must clearly state each grade level or course the publisher deems appropriate.
- Textbook materials will only be evaluated for the grade levels or courses specified by the Publisher.

In accordance to the directions below and the 2022 Invitation, publishers are to fill out the bid submission cost proposal spreadsheet. When you have completed the form, please save it with the naming style of *Company Name_2022 Cost Proposal* ex. IPD Publishing Company_2022 Cost Proposal.

Bid Submission

Enter each submission to be presented for evaluation with a 13-digit ISBN. If the submission contains various components, list the components on the spreadsheet. Each component within a submission should have a 13-digit ISBN. This is true even if the same submission is being offered over different periods of time (ex. a two-year offer vs. a five-year offer). Bold the line with the name of the submission and indent the name of any individual components. Do not use dashes when entering the ISBN information.

Enrichment Material Increments and Accompanying Student Material items

Enter a list of all bid materials with prices such as Student Edition, Teacher Edition, Digital Edition, and other support materials that will be provided at no additional cost based on the number of core bid materials purchased, such as accompanying student materials and teacher enrichment materials. Publishers may submit up to seven (7) items considered as Teacher Enrichment Materials and up to four (4) items considered as Accompanying Student Materials. Do not use dashes when entering the ISBN information. Example items are provided.

Submission Parameters & Bid Samples

Submission Parameters Print materials

- It is the responsibility of the Publisher to ensure that each submission is complete and correctly identified.
- Publishers shall provide sample textbook materials according to the schedule set by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
- Sample textbook materials that are print materials, shall be provided in electronic PDF format as designated by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
 Electronic versions of print materials must be complete and have the same format and content as the print versions. Links and/or access information for electronic materials must be provided.
- All materials must include the identification number that is supplied by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
- *Refer to pages 1 2 of the 2022 Invitation to see submission parameters.

Submission Parameters Technology-based programs/non-print materials

- Publishers shall provide access information for technology-based programs or other non-print materials according to the schedule set by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
- Access information for all materials must contain the identification number that is supplied by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

Submission Parameters Navigation Instructions for Non-Print Material

Publishers submitting technology-based programs or other nonprint materials must provide specific instructions on how to navigate all submitted digital materials through the online platform.

Navigation instructions may be provided by video or screen cast no longer than 10 minutes in length.

A link for access to a video or screen cast instructions with navigation instructions must be submitted through the NC platform for publishers according to the schedule and bid proposal guidelines set by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

Access to the instructions must work at all times through October 6, 2022. Contact information for technical support must be provided in the bid submission.

Bid Samples

- DPI Official Samples

 - The official samples must be shipped as explained in the 2022 Invitation.

Bid Samples

- Bid sample materials will be submitted electronically through the NC platform for publishers
 - Submit samples no earlier than May 9th and no later than May 16th
- The DPI official sample must be mailed to the Textbook Warehouse.
 - Official samples will arrive no earlier than May
 9th and no later than May 16th

By submitting textbooks for evaluation, publishers and producers agree to follow the procedures set forth in this document. Failure to comply with all procedures, including stated deadlines, will result in disqualification for the annual evaluation and adoption of textbooks in selected subject categories for use in North Carolina. The entire Invitation document must be returned with your bid submission.

Authority for the North Carolina State Board of Education to adopt textbooks is codified in the General Statutes of North Carolina §115C-85 through §115C-102. Only publishers listed on the North Carolina Publishers Registry are allowed to submit textbooks in response to the requirements of this document, and all responses must conform to the specified requirements.

The 2021 textbook evaluation will include the subject grade levels/courses listed on pages 4-8. In the cost proposal spreadsheet (see Attachment 4 for a sample), publishers must identify each textbook to be evaluated by title, grade level/course, and ISBN.

As cited in GS 115C-85, textbook is defined as:

"... systematically organized material comprehensive enough to cover the primary objectives outlined in the standard course of study for a grade or course. Formats for textbooks may be print or non-print, including hardbound books, softbound books, activity-oriented programs, classroom kits, and technology-based programs that require the use of electronic equipment in order to be used in the learning process."

Technology-based programs may include subscription or web-based materials.

Submission Parameters

- Textbook materials may be submitted for any grade level/course the publisher deems appropriate. Cost proposal spreadsheets must clearly state each grade level/course the publisher deems appropriate.

Publishers must provide textbook evaluation materials using the NC platform for publishers provided by NCDPI. A username and/or password must be provided if required to access materials. Publishers must also provide navigation instructions for technology-based or other non-print materials. It is the responsibility of the publisher to ensure that each submission is complete and correctly identified. Contact information for technical support must be provided.

In Person Meeting Virtual Meeting **Evaluation Displays (Required)** Publishers must set up textbook materials and hardware at the evaluation location and must check in at the textbook evaluation registration area. Publishers, not hotel personnel, are responsible for having materials and hardware on site and set up between 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. (noon) (EST) on Sunday, June 12th. Prior arrangements must be made with hotel management before any shipments will be accepted by the hotel. No shipments may be sent more than three days prior to June 12th. be provided. Oversized displays are not allowed due to limited space The materials should be easily located and displayed on tabletops only. Banners may be used if the banner process shall provide: includes company name only. Only bid materials may be 1.
