The purpose of this program is to:	The McKinney-Vento Act guarantees a free, appropriate public education for all homeless children and youth by removing barriers to their enrollment and attendance in school and supporting their educational success. The purpose of McKinney-Vento subgrants is to facilitate the enrollment, attendance, and success in school of homeless children and youth.
Allowable Cost Examples:	Services provided with funds must not replace the regular academic program and must be designed to expand upon or improve services provided to homeless students as part of the school's regular academic program, including compliance with the law. LEAs must use funds to assist homeless children and youth with enrolling, attending, and succeeding in school. In particular, the funds may support supplemental educational services (tutoring and other academic programs), expedited evaluations for various educational services, professional development activities, defraying the excess cost of transportation, provision of early childhood education programs for pre-school aged homeless children, services to retain unaccompanied youth in school, before/after-school, mentoring, summer programs with educational activities/academically focused, development of coordination with agencies providing services, violence prevention counseling and referrals for homeless students, adaptation of space and purchase of supplies for non-school facilities to provide services, school supplies, including those to be distributed at shelters or other locations, supplies for the homeless liaison, to pay in part or in full for the position of the homeless liaison and other extraordinary or emergency assistance needed to enable homeless students to attend school.
Grant Rules or Special Spending Provisions:	Subgrant funding is contingent upon the annual allocation to the state of NC. Eligibility of all North Carolina LEA's and charters with 50 or more students identified as homeless or LEAs with less than 50 reported homeless students can submit an application with a consortium of districts whose number of identified students totaled at least 50 or more.
Carryover:	Each project is awarded funds for a period of time beginning July 1 and ending September 30 of the following fiscal year. Funds for Years 2 and 3 will be authorized upon submission of a satisfactory annual program report and budget expenditure report for the previous year. The start date of funding may vary according to the date of receipt of funds from the U.S. Department of Education.
