Gear Up for the 2023-24 Annual Agreement Renewal Process

As we gear up for the 2023-24 Annual Agreement Renewal Process, the N.C. Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), Office of School Nutrition is providing the Free and Reduced Priced School Meals Household Application Packet now so that School Food Authorities (SFAs) can get an early start on the Agreement process for the upcoming school year. Please find attached the following items for your use on the Free & Reduced (F & R) Price School Meals Household Application webpage:

Instructions:

- PREPARE the SFA F&R Application and letter templates on SFA letterhead in the completed state as if it is ready to be distributed to households.
- EMAIL the SFA's Free and Reduced Priced School Meals Household Application packet for review and approval to Kayla Banks at kayla.banks@dpi.nc.gov. Once the packet is approved, it will be returned to you via email for your files.

Important Reminders:

- SFAs must submit their F&R App and Verification forms to the State Agency for approval PRIOR TO distribution to households.
- DO NOT upload the F&R Priced School Meals Household Application packet in the SN Technology System.
 The Free and Reduced Priced School Meals Household Application should be emailed to Kayla Banks at kayla.banks@dpi.nc.gov for review and approval.

Make Your Voice Heard – Submit Comments on New Child Nutrition Standards Proposed Rule – Due 4/10

On February 3, the USDA, Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) announced a new proposed rule, "<u>Child Nutrition Programs: Revisions to Meal Patterns Consistent With the 2020 Dietary Guidelines for Americans</u>". The proposed rule contains new Child Nutrition regulations regarding the School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program, Summer Food Service Programs, and Child and Adult Care Food Program.

Every voice matters! Submit your comments on how the new regulations in the proposed rule will impact your programs. The actual number of comments received makes a tremendous difference in the outcome. USDA will review and record all comments submitted. The standards are available for public comment for 60 days from February 7 through April 10, 2023. School Nutrition professionals and other stakeholders are encouraged to review the proposed rule and related materials and submit comments.

Apply for Professional Development Scholarships - Due 3/31

The deadline for School Nutrition Foundation Professional Development Scholarships is March 31, 2023. School Nutrition Association (SNA) members can achieve their educational dreams with a scholarship from the School Nutrition Foundation. These scholarships are intended to provide funding for tuition and books for the following school year. Three (3) scholarships are available for 2023: Superhero Scholarship from Bart Christian (multiple scholarships available each year), Schwan's Food Service Scholarship (multiple scholarships of up to \$2,500 each), and the Nancy Curry Scholarship (one scholarship of \$500 is awarded each year, funded by Handgards, Inc., and friends of Nancy). The Appalachian Sustainable Agriculture Project (ASAP), Growing Minds program wants to help fund your farm to school project in Western North Carolina! This mini-grant program connects K-12 schools throughout the eighteen westernmost counties of North Carolina with local agriculture and gives children positive experiences with healthy local foods through the four components of farm to school: farm field trips, local food cooking and taste tests, school gardens, and local food served in school cafeterias. Farm to school activity mini-grants will be provided up to \$1,000. Mini-grant applications are due every month on the 15th through April 15, 2023 and will be awarded by the 30th of each month!
