Register for 2023 SNA-NC Pre-Conference Workshops

The N.C. The sessions will be held at the Koury Convention Center.

Pre-Conference Session 1: New School Nutrition Manager Workshop

- This workshop is designed for new and aspiring School Nutrition Managers. It will include introductory information and overviews for meal patterns and offer vs. serve, meal counting and claiming, cash management and accountability, food safety and a Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP) plan, inventory management, production records, and customer service.
- This session will begin on Monday (June 19) with registration beginning at 12:30 pm. The first day will end at 5:00 pm. The second day will begin with registration at 8:30 am and will end at 3:30 pm.

Pre-Conference Session 2: Safe Plates for Managers

- This workshop is designed to help School Nutrition Administrators/Directors, School Nutrition Managers, and other Persons in Charge (PICs) obtain a Certified Food Protection Manager certification. This certification is required for School Nutrition Administrators/Directors as part of Professional Standards hiring requirements and is also required for PICs of food establishments per the North Carolina Food Code.
- A preparation course begins on the first day and ends on the second day. After the conclusion of the preparation course on the afternoon of the second day, participants will be given an opportunity to take the exam. The exam provided at the conclusion of this workshop meets the requirements for an American National Standards Institute (ANSI)-accredited exam option.
- This session will begin on Monday (June 19) with registration beginning at 9:30 am. The first day will end at 6:00 pm. The second day will begin with registration at 8:30 am and will end at 5:00 pm. The exam will be 2:45 pm-5:00 pm on the second day.
